Stumped by religious doctrines, theology, systematic and philosophical thinking Dr. Gary began to search the Word, comparing the Word with itself to find the answers. By putting it back in the contextual origin of its authorship, that is when things became more clear. The Ruach HaKodesh was leading into a deeper understanding of not only who YHWH was but what He desires for each of us as believers in His Son, Yahsuha.

Today, the journey continues but with one surprising bonus. The more you trust the leading of the Ruach HaKodesh to reveal YHWH's Word to you, the more of a personal relationship you have with your Creator, Elohim Yahweh and His Son Yahshua.
